Update: LOPC's advocacy for the exoneration of the Port Chicago 50

Sponsored by LOPC's Racial Equity and Engagement Team and Mission Team

The Racial Equity and Engagement Team is pleased to announce that the Session of LOPC approved our motion to affirm support for the efforts urging the President, Congress of the United States, and Secretary of the Navy to take all necessary actions to restore honor to, and rectify the mistreatment by the United States Military of, any sailors who were unjustly blamed for and convicted of mutiny after the Port Chicago disaster, which occurred in the town of Port Chicago, California, in 1944. This approval by session came after an education event for the congregation led by LOPC member and attorney, Jonathan Lee on January 28, 2024. LOPC will now be listed as a supporter of the Port Chicago Task Force formed by the Contra Costa County Bar Association.
